Collective Impact Definition

At its simplest level, Collective Impact happens when a core group of people or organizations come together around a shared goal with a common set of strategies and metrics. No individual agendas. No duplication. Everyone bringing their strengths to the table to solve a community-wide social issue that cannot be solved alone.

The Power of Collective Impact

The power of Collective Impact is that by working together, we drive measurable, lasting impact that none of us can achieve alone. One illustration of this is Collective Giving. When we each give a little, we lessen the financial burden to each individual, and we exponentially increase the impact that we make together.

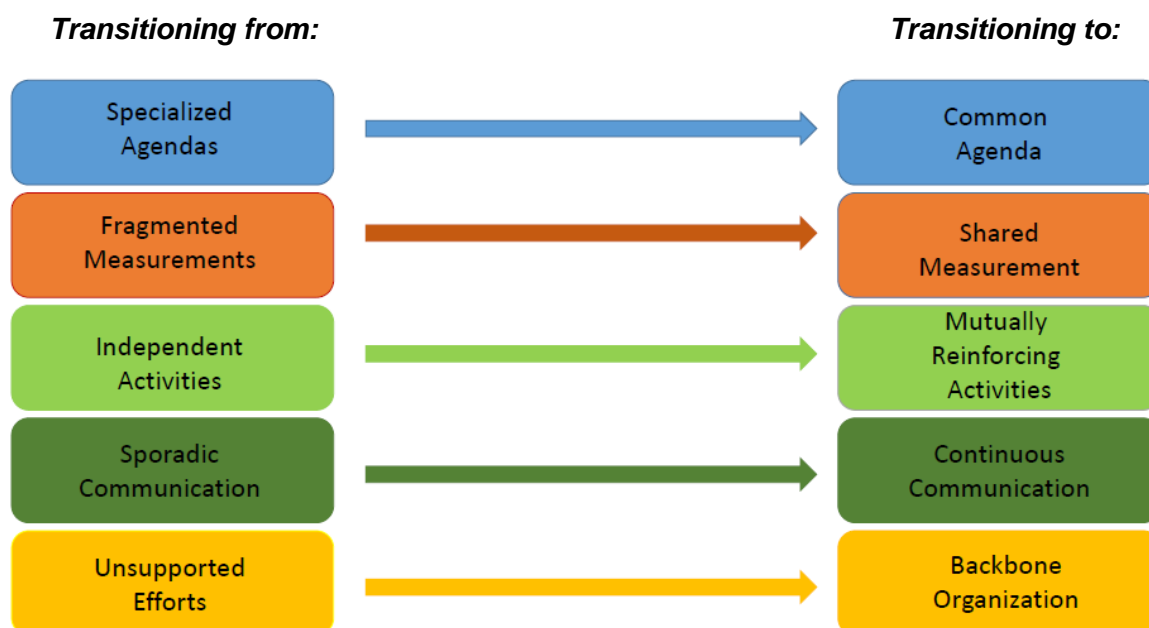
Consider this...if half the people in the 9 counties that United Way of Northern California serves gave just \$5 every two weeks (or \$130 annually), we would raise \$39.7 million per year. Imagine the lasting changes that would happen in our community with those resources!

The true power of Collective Impact happens when we then start working together across the community to coordinate, share, and align our resources and activities to accomplish shared community goals.

Five Conditions for Collective Impact

Communities across the nation have been working together in a Collective Impact framework for nearly a decade now and they are producing measurable, replicable results and moving the needle on multi-generational social issues that prior to now have not been solved.

These communities have found that there are certain factors and frameworks that help to ensure the success of Collective Impact initiatives. One of these is the Five Conditions for Collective Impact. They are:
